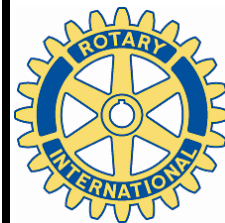

## Invocation, Pledge and 4-Way Test: Sarah Later Rotary Moment No. 515, Interact: John Dick

In the late 1950s a Rotary club in Florida organized a service club for high school age students. The first clubs were called "Ro" clubs. Much earlier than that there were a few clubs with a name that I will not try to pronounce. It was Rotary spelled backwards! Try saying that in your spare time. The immediate predecessors to Interact were "Wheel" clubs in the Miami area. Bill Robbins, who became president of Rotary International in 1974, was an early proponent of this idea. An international committee consisting of one Rotarian each from Asia, Europe, Latin America, North America and the Southwest Pacific was formed to study the idea and make recommendations to the board of directors of RI. The board of directors, under the leadership

of President Nitish Laharry of India, accepted the recommendation of the committee and officially adopted Interact as a program of Rotary in 1962. Late in that year the first Interact club was chartered in Melbourne, Florida.

The name Interact was derived by combining portions of the words "international" and "action". The first club organized in our Rotary District was sponsored by the Anderson Rotary Club in 1964 and included students from the four high schools of the time; Anderson, Madison Heights, Highland and St. Mary's. In succeeding years the club successfully completed several significant international projects but sadly faded away at the end of the decade from lack of support by our Rotary

club. The Anderson Interact club was revived 10 years ago and once again became the only one in our district. Fortunately, there are now 12 others in Central Indiana including Fishers, Zionsville, Carmel, Brownsburg, and two in Kokomo.

From the beginning in 1962 Interact has continued to expand. Today there are approximately 246,000 Interactors in 10,700 clubs in 109 countries. We are proud that the Anderson Interact club is one of those. Interact has grown faster even than Rotary did in its early years.

Interact is doing well...AND... doing good.

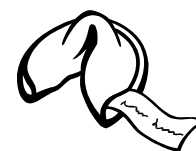
