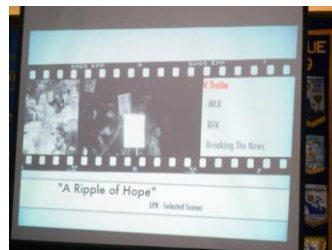
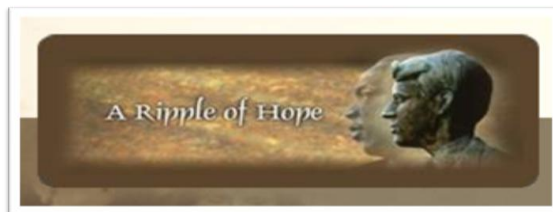
Dr. Don Boggs, “A Ripple of Hope” June 1, 2010

Dr. Don Boggs began his presentation with a short introduction to what he believes to be the place of movies in today’s culture. Drawing comparison to the importance influence of yesteryear’s Sunday morning sermons, Boggs contends that, “Movies are today’s pulpit.”

Dr. Boggs then spoke about the documentary, “A Ripple of Hope” (<http://rippleofhopemovie.com>) produced by Covenant Productions of Anderson University. The films website describes the film as a dramatic retelling “...of the events of April 4, 1968, the day that Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated outside a Memphis hotel room. It poignantly retraces the steps of Presidential Candidate Robert Kennedy as he absorbs the news of the killing and responds with courage and compassion. With digitally restored news footage and original music by John Colby, Grammy Award winning music director of the Ken Burns Civil War soundtrack, A Ripple of Hope dramatically narrates the events of that tragic day 40 years ago thru the eyes of those who were there.”

You will recall that this speech was delivered in Indianapolis at what is today called Martin Luther King Memorial Park (N. Broadway). While there were major riots in major cities across the US that night, this speech is credited for the relative calm in Indianapolis.
