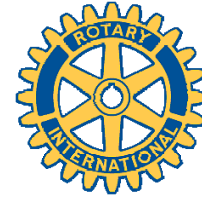

Mary Katherine traveled to Ghana to participate in National Immunization Day (NID) with Rotary in November of 2006. The goal of NID was to immunize one million children, protecting them from the devastating disease of polio.

Rotary is making a difference. In 1985, there were 1000 reported Polio cases a day; in 2006, only 285 cases were reported during the entire year!
